Andrew J. Lee

Andrew Lee is director of research and policy analysis at Aetna, one of the nation's leading providers of health, group, life, disability and long-term care insurance. From 1998 to 2005, Mr. Lee served as executive director of the Harvard Project on American Indian Economic Development at Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government. From 1996 to 1998 he worked for the Ford Foundation. Mr. Lee serves on a number of boards, including the Nathan Cummings Foundation, the Smithsonian's Heye Center of the National Museum of the American Indian, and Indian Dispute Resolution Services, Inc. He also serves on the tribal policy board for the Institute for Tribal Government at Portland State University, the national selection committee for the "Leadership for a Changing World" awards, and the board of governors of Harvard's Honoring Nations tribal governance awards program. Mr. Lee was born and raised in Connecticut and his extended family resides on the Seneca Nation's Cattaraugus Indian Reservation in western New York. He received his undergraduate degree from Hamilton College and a master degree in public policy from Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government, where he was a Christian A. Johnson Native American fellow and a Woodrow Wilson fellow.
