

Cheryl Crazy Bull serves as President of Northwest Indian College, a regional tribally chartered institution serving tribes in the Pacific Northwest. She has been in this role since October 1, 2002.

Ms. Crazy Bull is an enrolled member of the Sicangu Band of the Lakota Nation, also known as the Rosebud Sioux Tribe. She currently has over 25 years of experience in K-12, adult and higher education, primarily with Native American Institutions. She holds a Master of Education in Educational Leadership, from South Dakota State University. Her Bachelor of Science degree is in Business Administration with Management Emphasis, from University of South Dakota.

Ms. Crazy Bull worked as the Chief Educational Officer, in a K-12 tribally chartered school (1998-2002). She worked at Sinte Gleska University as Vice President, Administration and Director for Institutional Relations, Dean for Instructional Programs, Director for Women's Project, Planning Officer, Instructor, and Department Chair (1981-1995). Her organizational and educational consulting business, Red Buffalo Partnership, continues to provide services to various native organizations throughout Indian Country.

She currently serves as a member of the Board of the Lummi Commercial Company, the Lummi Nation for-profit enterprise management division. In October 2005, President Crazy Bull was elected to her second term as President of the American Indian Higher Education Consortium (AIHEC). AIHEC serves as the advocacy and capacity development group for its member institutions. She serves as Chair of the AIHEC Research Committee and is a published author of several articles on community based and native research as well as other educational topics.
